Appointed by the Republic's interim president and then Africa's first female head of state,

Massaquoi was the first post-war Inspector General of Liberia's National Police forces, responsible for leading and directing an apparatus of over 5,000+ police officers across the nation. The hallmark of Director Massaquoi's leadership at LNP is the complete restoration and reinstatement of the country's police force/law enforcement within limited financial resources while leveraging lean operations and supplemental international partnerships.

- Spearheaded and chaired the implementation of several high-level strategy, policy, and operating
  procedures within critical Fleet Management, Logistics Management, and Procurement
  departments, ultimately standardizing and professionalizing critical sector of the LNP that led to
  better internal administration and external operating efficiencies.
- Professionalized and retrained the Emergency Response Unit (ERU) and Police Support Unit (PSU), foundational apparatuses to Liberia's contemporary police force, via professional armament with long range and side weapons; Operationalized these two units within a decentralized policing structure, establishing and distributing units to 5 regional operational hubs throughout the country.
- Established, developed, and maintained working relationships with international security experts and peacekeeping forces at ECOWAS, the Africa Union, the EU, the United Nations, UNMIL, INTERPOL, the United States Federal Bureau of Investigations, and various other American policing agencies and Police Chiefs including New York, Philadelphia, California, and Washington DC; Coordinated the full implementation of the formal disarmament, demobilization, and reintegration (DDR) of ex-combatants in the immediate post-conflict environment, resulting in the collection of 27,000 weapons.

  Arms and Light Weapons and the international Arms Trade Treaty; Prior to the establishment of an
  independent Small Arms Commission, Massaquoi orchestrated efforts to mark and code all known

  manifest.

- Revitalized the BIN's national mandate to enforce and administer the Alien and Nationality Laws of
  the Republic of Liberia; oversee efforts to counter terrorism and enhance national security; secure
  and manage the borders while facilitating trade and travel; safeguard and provide support for
  national and economic security in coordination with local, national, private, and international sector
  partners.
